site to virtual assemblies and interactive activities with two additional hosting 4-H Centers (W.E. Skelton 4-H Educational Conference Center and Southwest Virginia 4-H Educational Center) we were able to share 4-H Congress with Virginia 4-H again this year. Virginia 4- H All Stars is an honor/service organization for teen and adult leaders who are actively involved in expanding and enhancing the 4-H programs in their communities and statewide. Membership with All Stars is the highest recognition that a 4-H'er in Virginia can achieve.

4-H All Stars contribute to positive youth development through service locally and statewide. 4-H members begin their story by gaining knowledge through trainings, experiences and information, and then utilize their knowledge to provide leadership and life skills to other 4-H participants. Members that have transitioned into applying their 4-H knowledge and skills into leadership roles and promote "Making the Best Better," can apply to become an All Star. Applicants should have at least 3 years experience with 4-H and be between 15 and 19 years-old.

Together We Serve

Members inducted into the Virginia Chapter of All Stars are dedicated to serving their local 4-H community. Working together as Virginia All Stars, youth make an impact in developing self-motivated youth and implementing interactive youth development education programs for all of Virginia. All Stars strive for better understanding, patience, dedication and unselfish service to fellow 4-H members and 4-H programs. Virginia All Stars may attend additional events and apply for additional scholarships specific to Virginia All Stars.

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National 4-H: Pollinator Week

Did you know that ants can lift 20 to 100 times their own bodyweight? Or that butterflies can see the color red but bees cannot? This National Pollinators Week, we're joining Corteva to share more about why these insects and animals are essential links in nature with fun and educational activities for kids of all ages on 4-H at Home.





Ants - Start off 4-H Pollinators by learning about ants and the role they play in pollination and how they work as a community. They are hard workers! Get to work making your own craft ant as you get to know these small but mighty insects. Grades: Pre-K-3



Bats - You probably don't think about bats as pollinators. It's true! Design a bat mask as you learn about the different types of bats and how these flying mammals take part in pollination and keep their ecosystem healthy. Grades: Pre-K-5



Bees - You've probably seen bees buzzing around flowers and know they make honey, but there is so much more to these fuzzy bugs! Get busy making your own craft honey bee while learning about how bees help pollinate. Grades: K-7



Butterflies - Butterflies are more than just a pretty bug. Just like bees, they're hard at work as they travel from flower to flower. Learn about the butterfly life cycle and how these winged beauties take part in pollination. Grades: Pre-K-4



Humming Birds - See if you can attract a glimmer of hummingbirds! Using recycled materials and simple craft supplies, make your own hummingbird feeder while learning about how these tiny birds pollinate flowers. Grades: 3-10

Hokie Bug Camp 2021

Hokie BugCamp is a hands-on, summer program that gives kids ages 9-13 a chance to get outside and learn more about the exciting science of bugs. This year's camp will keep families and volunteers safe by combining a FREE outdoor bug hunt with take-home Hokie BugBoxes. Campers will register to attend one collecting session – either Friday, July 30 or Saturday, July 31.

Camp highlights include:


- Hands-on collecting: With nets in hand, young entomologists will learn how to collect and identify insects, where to look for hard-to-find critters, and how to scoop and transfer specimens. (Collecting equipment will be provided.)
- Insect pinning and ID: Once collecting jars are full, campers will learn how to pin, label, and display their insects as they begin to build their own collections.
- Learning from the experts: Virginia Tech graduate students, faculty, and staff will be on-hand to help these budding entomologists hone their skills. (CDC and local COVID guidelines will be followed.)
- Summer scavenger hunt: While on their bug hunt, campers (and younger siblings) will be challenged to find a list of our region's most common summer critters.
- Insect trading post: A chance for campers to share what they find and trade with others to build variety in what they take home. Additional specimens from the Virginia Tech Department of Entomology will be on-hand for observation or trade as well.
- Hokie BugBoxes: Take-home entomology kits will be available for purchase (\$60 ea.). Each box includes a camp shirt + everything campers need to continue their study and build their own insect collections at home (collecting net, viewing jar, ID guides, pining supplies, display box, access to special online activities, and more).
- Insect Collection Contest: Campers will be invited to continue building their collections through the summer and enter them in the Insect Collection Contest at Hokie BugFest this fall!

Registration is FREE but required and is limited to 25 campers each day on a first come first serve basis. Registration will be open until filled or through July 14. Register at: https://forms.gle/joF4LCffEVHONE5XA.
