



The 4-H Congress Leadership Team is working to put together a great, high quality educational leadership program for our participants that will provide the same level of learning and fun that is typically experienced with Congress in Blacksburg. We anticipate utilizing updated technologies at the 4-H centers to provide synchronous virtual programming for statewide assemblies and workshops, as well as giving districts ample time to provide their own in-person programs on site. Competitions will occur virtually outside of Congress, as was the case last year, and winners will be announced at the conclusion of Congress along with the annual Share the Fun Show. Also like last year, the Virginia 4-H All Stars will have time to conduct a virtual welcome ceremony – although we will not be able to conduct in-person tapping ceremonies at each location due to our safety guidelines. Housing, meals, social activities, etc. will follow the same health and safety guidelines at each center as we are using for 4-H camps.



We challenge YOU! Create a short video that inspires positive change! Be creative and think outside the box. Use your smartphone to create the video. You can create a photo slide show with narration and animation etc. It's up to you, just be sure that your video inspires positive change.

Your video can inspire positive changes in relationships with friends and family or with leaders of nations and anything in-between. You might want to talk about race relations or diversity. If your passion is animal-rights or saving-the-planet, speak on one of those topics. It's up to you.
