## Travis' Healthy Tip: Complex and Low GI Carbs

Complex carbohydrates are slow releasing, taking longer to be absorbed by the body and provide sustained energy during exercise. Whole fruits and vegetables, dairy, whole grains, sweet potatoes, and legumes are the best sources of low GI carbohydrates. These foods come with the added benefit of nutrients and vitamins including calcium, fiber and iron and help runners feel fuller for longer. Make sure to not eat right before running however! Eating right before a run can upset your stomach, and you won't perform well. Always give your body time to digest properly.

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## Congratulations to 4-H Members Recognized at County Meeting



PWC 4-H Members Alison Dixon, Kayla Dixon, and Tracey Whysong were selected as Volunteer of the Month with Virginia Cooperative Extension, Prince William Unit for their hard work and dedication to the 4-H program. Our volunteers were recognized last week with a proclamation presented at the Prince William Board of County Supervisors meeting. Thank you for your willingness to share your time and energy with VCE to benefit the Greater Prince William community!

#### Here's a glimpse into how our 4-H Volunteers shine:

Alison Dixon stepped in to fill a much-needed adult leadership role for one of the county program's equestrian clubs. Embracing volunteer training teachings, Alison took on management of administrative needs for the club in addition to serving as a mentor to club youth. Club youth are quick to point out that of all the learning or volunteering opportunities, organizing of meetings, horse show attendance logistics and support, and the many contests they are involved in, all have Alison's guidance and organizational support to thank. Alison's leadership and commitment to serving and guiding our county youth, as well as marketing expertise for county level opportunities and fundraisers has made her a standout volunteer over the years. She is always willing to step in and help when asked and, for that, as well as her 'calm under pressure' demeanor, we are extremely grateful for all she brings to the PWC 4-H program.

Kayla Dixon is a senior 4-H member and a Senior at Colgan High School. Kayla has been a 4-H member since 2014 and has been actively engaged in project work and leadership roles ever since. Kayla was inducted into the Virginia 4-H All Stars in 2020 which is the highest recognition a 4-H'er can receive. She continues to fulfill the All-Star's goal of contributing to positive youth development through "service" to the 4-H program as a Virginia State 4-H Horse Ambassador where she has had the opportunity to lead in a variety of outreach and public service capacities, connecting with the community, assisting with 4-H local and District level equine events, meeting with legislators to discuss ways to help grow the 4-H Horse Program and the Equine Community. Kayla created an "Introduction to Horses" lessons for elementary school aged youth, and the Intro to Horse Judging recorded video for FFA Teacher's Conference.

She was also featured in State Line Tack's Spotlight of the Month. Kayla has served her club in many roles but most recently as both the Vice President and President. She has taken on county level leadership last year by serving as the Youth Co-President of the Prince William 4-H Association, the county program's 501c3 entity. Currently, Kayla serves the 4-H Association as the Youth Vice President and is working with the adult Vice President to stand up committees to focus on fundraising, budgeting, and recognition. Most recently, Kayla answered a call for help to lead a service-oriented project utilizing a recently donated large supply of yarn. "Crochet for a Cause" was launched and after thoughtful and detailed planning, Kayla led virtual sessions to teach other youth and some adults how to crochet and to create useful products to be donated to the community.

Tracey Whysong has been a volunteer with Prince William 4-H for over ten years and has served the community as club leader of Nokesville Equestrian Club for the past five. Under Tracey's leadership, club members have excelled in horse knowledge competitions with youth qualifying for state level teams and in leadership with youth members being accepted into the Virginia 4-H Horse Ambassador program. While project work is the primary focus of the club, Tracey keeps the youth membership grounded in service to the community through the ongoing commitment to service-learning

activities. Visits to nursing home residents, organizing meals for families in need or in times of great loss, barn clean up and animal care for neighbors in need, locker room (virtual) chats for teens during COVID and caroling on horseback are among the many events that have transpired under Tracey's leadership. In addition to her strong commitment to the club, Tracey is an avid supporter of the 4-H program overall. Through recruitment efforts and word of mouth testimonials about the impact of 4-H programming and experiences on the youth in the club, Tracey embraces the very essence of a strong and dedicated volunteer.

VCE recognizes a volunteer each month, announced during National Volunteer Week at the Board of County Supervisors Meeting. Each of the 4 VCE programs have three volunteers recognized for the year.

The Paper Clover Fundraising Campaign is a semi-annual event held in partnership with Tractor Supply Co. and National 4-H. 
