We hope to see all PW 4-H'ers at Portfolio Training in January!

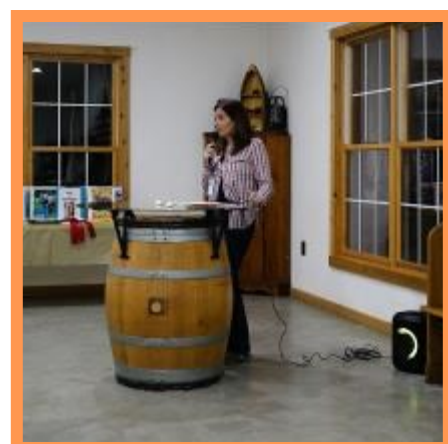

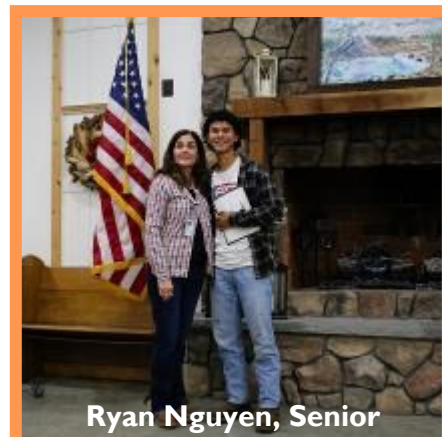

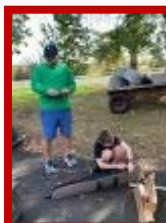
Trigger Time Scores Season Record

October 27, 2024. Over the past week, Trigger Time 4-H gave their best effort in the fourth match of the National Sporter Air Rifle League, posting their highest score of the season. It was a close game, but Lafayette Gun Club came out on top by a mere 4.6 points, Lafayette (1117.3), Trigger Time (1112.7). Contributing to the team score were Rebecca Ahrens (287), Tanner Ridings (279.3), Lexi Strand (277.7), and Noah Richter (268.7). The highest standing shot this week was Lexi Strand with a 10.6. Rebecca Ahrens and Koa Mintz tied for the second highest shot each hitting a 10.3. Setting personal season records this week were Tanner Ridings, Sophie Carter, and Aisling Mintz. Trigger Time is currently ranked 18th in the league with a record of 2-2.

October 1st began the new 4-H year. Last Saturday, the club members sorted and took inventory of all the team gear and cleaned the equipment trailers. Thank you to everyone who assisted in the project. Trigger Time is ready for another great 4-H year!

Virginia 4-H All Stars is an honor/service organization for teen and adult leaders who are actively involved in expanding and enhancing the 4-H programs in their communities and statewide. Membership with Virginia 4-H All Stars is the highest recognition that a 4-H'er in Virginia can achieve.

Virginia 4-H All Stars contribute to positive youth development through service locally and statewide. 4-H members begin their story by gaining knowledge through trainings and experiences, and then utilize their knowledge to provide leadership and life skills to other 4-H participants. Members that have transitioned into applying their 4-H knowledge and skills into leadership roles and promote "Making the Best Better," can apply to become an All Star. Applicants should have at least 3 years experience with 4-H and be between 15 and 19 years-old.

Discover Your Inner Trailblazer

NOVA 4-H Nature Club is a new, multi-county youth leadership club focused on learning about nature, exploring local natural areas, and using that knowledge to preserve habitat, become change agents for environmental awareness and conservation, and take a leadership role in the community. Interested teens have the opportunity to participate in Envirothon & WHEP competitions. The leader, Joy Green, is a Master Naturalist with Prince William County who lives in Stafford County.

Here's the weekly plan for each month:

WEEK 1 - Topic Overview (virtual): During the first few weeks of each month, we will introduce the monthly topic and discuss logistics for our monthly outing.

WEEK 2 or 3 - Outing (in-person): We will visit sites in the NoVA area related to the monthly topic (for example, a bird walk for Ornithology month or visit a river for fish and river habitats for Ichthyology month). These may be led by a Master Naturalist, Park Ranger, or an expert in the field.

WEEK 4 - 4-H Business Meeting (hybrid): During each month, we will hold 4-H Club Member meetings to plan group service projects and fundraisers (if desired). Club members will prepare short presentations on topics and will discuss ways to represent this club in the NoVA area and beyond.

The State 4-H Office is once again pleased to announce this exciting award opportunity for 4-H'ers across Virginia. To provide a similar system to the National 4-H Youth in Action Awards, and to encourage high quality applications for the national awards, the State 4-H Office established the Virginia 4-H Youth in Action Awards Program in 2019. The nomination process is now open for our Class of 2025 Youth in Action winners. Youth may recommend themselves for consideration in one or more of the pillar areas of Agriculture, Civic Engagement, Healthy Living, and STEM. One pillar winner will be chosen from each area. Any 4-H member in Virginia ages 15-18 is eligible to be nominated.

Each of the four winners will receive:

- A \$500 mini-grant to their Unit to develop a significant community project.
- Recognition at An Evening with Virginia 4-H in January 2025
- A full scholarship to attend Virginia 4-H State Congress in June 2025, in Blacksburg, VA.
- An opportunity to be featured as the Virginia 4-H Youth Spokesperson for their pillar area.
- An opportunity to represent Virginia 4-H at a national event for their pillar area.
- Support and mentorship to apply for the 2026 National 4-H Youth in Action Awards.
- An official reference letter from the Virginia State 4-H Program Leader, Jeremy C. Johnson

"The Beginning of Life" 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. Educational material address Virginia SOLs for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. Prince William 4-H provides fertilized eggs, guides participants through training, supports participants during the hatch, and then collects the chicks to be sent to a local farm.

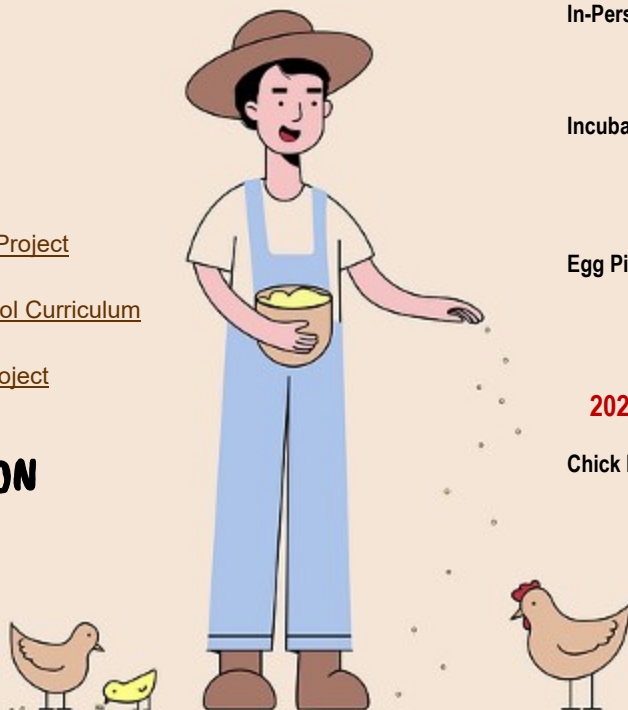
