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IMPORTANT ACTION ITEM for PW 4-H TEENS



Nominations for Virginia 4-H State Cabinet will be opening soon! The Virginia 4-H Cabinet has amended its bylaws and, beginning this year, voting for the Cabinet will now be open to all Virginia 4-H members ages 14 and up who are fully enrolled in 4-H Online no later than March 1, 2025. PLEASE CHECK YOUR TEEN'S ACCOUNT TODAY!

To meet this requirement, it involves two critical pieces:

- A youth member must be individually enrolled in Virginia 4-H through 4-H Online
- The youth member must also have an individual email address listed on their personal 4-H Online profile.

Having an email address only for the family profile is not sufficient. There must also be an email on the member's profile (even if it is the same as the family account) Using the same email address for more than one individual profile will result in both profiles being deemed ineligible to vote.

PW 4-H Campers Celebrate Citizenship



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Prince William 4-H'ers Attend W+g Sisterhood Event



state-wide anti-bullying campaign. She went on to be a runner-up in the national Youth in Action Awards.













IST ANNUAL TRIGGER TIME CUP

February 26, 2025. This past weekend, Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club hosted the 1st Annual Trigger Time Cup. Overall, there were 56 competitors from more than eight different teams that participated in the CMP sanctioned competition. Members of the Trigger Time 4-H Club helped run the match throughout the day by collecting and scoring targets and setting up and tearing down the range and equipment. Twelve members of Trigger Time formed three teams to compete in the match. Taking first place was American Legion Post 290 Junior Shooters with a score of 2192 - 68. In second was Trigger Time team I (Rebecca Ahrens, Lexi Strand, Tanner Ridings, and Ayden Strand) and Calvert NIROTC took third. Comments from the visiting teams were positive, and Trigger Time plans to host more competitions in the future. TRIGGER TIME 4-H CLUB TAKES FIRST PLACE IN COMPETITIONS

February 26, 2025. Trigger Time 4-H Club members participated in the first of three CMP Virginia State Championships. Through this event, individuals and teams can qualify for Nationals. The Trigger Time team took first place with a score of 2084-28 (Rebeca Ahrens 542-15, Lexi Strand 534-14, Ayden Strand 504-5, Tanner Ridings 503-14, and Samantha Holmes 488-11). Although Trigger Time met the automatic qualifying score for CMP Regionals based on their postal score, the team has now qualified for Nationals based on their score in the State Championship. The third place individual was Trigger Time 4-H'er Rebecca Ahrens. The team will compete in CMP Regionals at Camp Perry in Ohio in April.



The scores for the American Legion Postal Round I have been finalized. Out of 75 sporter teams, **Trigger Time 4-H Club took fourth place in the nation and first place in Virginia.** Trigger Time qualified for the team Postal Round 2. In addition, Rebecca Ahrens (Virginia 4-H State Champion) and Lexi Strand qualified for the individual round 2 match. The top 15 competitors in round 2 will be selected to compete in the American Legion National Championship at Hillsdale College.

Hello 4-H Families! Can you host a young person or adult chaperone from Japan this summer? It is a wonderful opportunity to learn about another culture first hand! Here are some hosting details:

- Program runs July 23 through August 16, 2025
- No previous 4-H experience is required
- Host families receive no stipend to host a delegate.
- All Host families will be screened and interviewed as part of our risk management protocol
- Japanese delegates are ages ~13-16
- To host a delegate, a family must have a child who is 10+ years old
- Families without young people at home can host adult chaperones
- Families hosting youth delegates must provide adult supervision during the daytime
- Families will identify a host sibling and will be matched with a delegate of the same gender who is within 4 years of the host youth's age.
- Japanese delegates have a range of English language abilities.
- Delegates are here to experience every day American life. No special activities need to be planned.
- Host Families will receive support from the state coordinator and other host families before, during & after the exchange (not financial)


