

Registration for the 2025 Virginia 4-H Congress is now open! This year's theme, "Turning Gears, Shaping Futures," will guide an inspiring week of learning, leadership, and connection.

2025 PROGRAM INFORMATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ 4-H STATE COMPETITIONS: 4-H members have a chance to compete with their peers from across the state. Participants with high scores in each blue-ribbon category will be recognized during the Closing ceremony on Friday, June 21st. Please see the competition information for more details.
- ★ PRE-CONGRESS ACTIVITY: Upon arrival, units and their chaperones can participate in a self-guided campus scavenger hunt after settling into the dorms. The State 4-H Office will provide all materials for the scavenger hunt. This will be a great activity to familiarize yourself and your delegation with the areas of campus we will be visiting throughout Congress.
- ★ WELCOME TO CONGRESS MIXER! On Tuesday evening, you can enjoy a welcome mixer, which will be held on Dietrick Lawn. This fun time will be hosted by your current State 4-H Cabinet members, along with Meet and Greets by the Congress Cabinet Candidates and 4-H All-Stars. There will be plenty of get-to-know-you activities, ice cream, and fun to go around!
- ★ OPENING SESSION: Featuring Mario Ferruzzi, Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Virginia Tech!
- ★ EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS: During State 4-H Congress, delegates will have the opportunity to choose from a variety of workshops with hands-on and engaging learning experiences. Congress workshops will consist of two interactive 60-minute sessions on Wednesday morning, followed by a longer 90-minute session on Thursday morning. Participants will be asked to select their top five (5) 3 workshop choices, and final assignments will be made prior to check-in. There is a listing of 2025 workshops in this packet and on the Congress website.
- ★ DANCES: At least one dance will be held. This is another great opportunity for delegates to mingle and meet other Congress participants. Alternate recreation will be available for those delegates who choose not to participate in the dance.
- ★ OPPORTUNITY FAIR: At the opportunity fair, participants can discover diverse pathways to participate in 4-H activities, interact with representatives from numerous ambassador groups, and access valuable resources to shape their future endeavors.
- COLOR RUN/WALK: Join us for our Color Run/Walk on Wednesday evening. This unique paint race celebrates healthiness, happiness, and individuality. Participants will receive a t-shirt and to participate in this event. There will be an additional cost of \$10 to participate in this event, and proceeds will help to support the State 4-H Congress.
- ★ SERVICE LEARNING: Each delegate will participate in a service learning project that will be held on Wednesday afternoon.
- CONGRESSIONAL GAMES: Congressional Games are coming back this year allowing Districts to compete in both individual and team activities. Points will be awarded in each category to districts based on participation and standing. Tournament style brackets will be utilized and games may include corn hole, volleyball, 3 on 3 basketball, 4 square, chess and other board games, swimming, and more!
- * **RECOGNITION OF 4-H ALL STARS:** During 4-H Congress, current and those who will be tapped into the All Stars will be recognized during an opening assembly program, and the tapping ceremony will be held on Thursday afternoon.
- ★ ALL STAR TAPPING: The All Star tapping will be held in an indoor location on Thursday afternoon. All Congress delegates (youth and adult participants) are expected to attend the All-Star tapping.
- ★ ALL STAR ORIENTATION: The All Star orientation will be held on Thursday from 2:45 3:45 PM.
- ★ STATE AWARDS AND CLOSING CEREMONY: On Friday morning, State 4-H Congress will close out with a special closing ceremony. This closing ceremony will honor all State 4-H Congress award recipients, including competition winners, 2025 National 4-H Congress delegates, Innovative Programming Awards, Fun Run winners, etc., and installing the 2025-26 State 4-H Cabinet. 

- July 1st: Deadline for Online Eligibility/Declaration in 4H Online. All horses that MAY be shown at the State 4-H Horse Show must be Declared in 4H Online.
- July 31st: Entry Deadline. Orientation Meeting/Checklist Completed by Club Leader or VCE Agent. All qualification requirements (ie. District Horse Show, Project Book, Horsemanship Skills) must be met or approved by the Club Leader and VCE Agent at this time.

STATE HORSE SHOW REQUIREMENTS, RULEBOOK, AND SCHEDULE

<u>2025 Rulebook</u> | <u>2025 Show Schedule</u> | <u>2025 Rule Updates</u> | <u>Overview of Requirements to Show</u> Please keep in mind, in order to utilize a horse as a "Substitute" or "Back Up" in the event of injury to the intended project horse, the back up horse must also be declared and qualified, just like the intended project animal.

2025 QUALIFYING SHOWS AND HORSEMANSHIP SKILLS

List of District Approved Qualifying Shows | Horsemanship Skills Opportunities Horsemanship Skills Testing is only required once per child, regardless of project animal.

QUESTIONS ON QUALIFYING

- Youth may attend ANY "District Approved" Qualifying show, regardless of their Unit of Enrollment. There is no additional paperwork that is due to attend a show outside of your District. EX. a youth from Augusta may attend a show in Doswell held within the NE District.
- All Districts have Opportunities for "Outside Qualifying Shows" in place. Please reach out to your District Horse Council if
 you are unable to attend a District Approved Show and are in need of an Outside Qualifying Opportunity for their guidelines
 and paperwork.

- Preference given to 4-H members who are also enrolled in FFA and/or have competed at the VA State Fair.
- Attach a type written essay up to 500 words: How has your involvement in 4-H contributed to your personal growth and influenced your choice to attend VT/chosen field of study?
- Include a letter from the 4-H agent or volunteer leader describing member's contribution to the local community and the 4-H program.
- Complete the scholarship application and required documents.





The Downside of Energy Drinks

Despite the delicious taste, cute packaging, and collabs with some of the biggest influencers of our time, energy drinks aren't "aesthetic". Regardless, they can be really tempting in the morning before school after staying up late scrolling on social media, studying, or talking to friends. Popular energy drink companies are quick to promise increased energy and reduced fatigue, but they often don't tell you the side effects of consuming such high amounts of caffeine daily. Studies show that a whopping 41% of children with ages ranging from 13-17 consume energy drinks regularly.

On average, energy drinks contain around 80-300 milligrams of caffeine, which is good news to highly performing athletes and tired students. For most people, the result of guzzling down an energy drink will be increased endurance and focus, but these results are also accompanied by increased heart rate, disturbed sleep, and even digestive issues.

While a lot of people use energy drinks to compensate for their early wake up calls, some mix these drinks with alcohol to mask the flavor. Not only does it mask the flavor, but the caffeine in the energy drink tricks your brain into thinking that you're more alert than you are. Using energy drinks for this purpose is incredibly dangerous and can result in heart strains.

An alternative to energy drinks would be to look at your sleep schedule. If you go to bed late and must wake up early for school or work, try to fall asleep earlier. A big factor in loss of sleep for teenagers right now is the usage of their phone at nighttime. It would be a good idea to set a screen time limit for apps that normally keep you up so that you have no reason to want to be on your phone late at night. Overall, the research shows that there are short-term positives, but long-term negatives. Social media influencers glorify these products, and some even go on to create their own energy drink brand. So, the next time you see your favorite celebrity doing an "outfit of the day" or "get ready with me" with an energy drink in their hand, ask yourself if it's worth it.


Exercise Your Mind



Simple At-Home Circuit

- Forward Lunge: stand with your feet shoulder-width apart, hands clasped in front of your chest. Step forward with your left foot, and plant it firmly on the floor. Bend both knees to create two 90-degree angles with your legs. Your chest should be upright and your torso should be slightly forward so that your back is flat and not arched or rounded forward. Your left quad should be parallel to the floor and your left knee should be above your left foot. Your butt and core should be engaged. Push through your left foot to return to the starting position. That's 1 rep. Complete 5-10 reps and then switch sides.
- Hands-Elevated Push-Up: place your hands shoulder-width apart on a low box or step and assume a high plank position with your feet, knees, hips, and shoulders in a straight line. Brace your core and keep your elbows tucked in close to the sides of your torso. Bend your elbows and pull shoulder blades together to lower your chest to the box. Press through your palms to straighten your arms back to the starting position. This is 1 rep. Complete 10-15 reps.
- Glute Bridge: lie on your back with your knees bent, feet flat on the floor hip-width apart, and arms at your sides. Squeeze your glutes and abs, and push through your heels to lift your hips a few inches off the floor until your body forms a straight line from your shoulders to your knees. Hold for a second and then slowly lower your hips to return to the starting position. This is 1 rep. Complete 10–15 reps.
- Superman With Pull-Down: lie face down on the floor with your arms at shoulder height and elbows bent to 90 degrees, so your shape roughly resembles a goalpost. From this position, engage your core and upper back as you lift your shoulders, arms, and chest off the floor. At the same time, squeeze your glutes and lift your feet off the floor as well. From this lifted position, gaze down toward the floor to keep your neck in a neutral position with your spine. Extend both of your hands overhead, then pull your shoulder blades back to pull your arms back to their goal post position. Exhale as you lower back to the floor. This is 1 rep. Complete 10–15 reps.



That feeling of alertness associated with caffeine is caused by caffeine blocking your brain's receptors for adenosine, a chemical that makes you feel tired. Too much caffeine can cause headaches, confusion, and even hallucinations and convulsions.
