Anxiously awaiting cuteness overload! As we patiently wait for our eggs to incubate, and care for the eggs, and study how our chicks are growing, and anticipate hatch day, there are other birds nesting in Virginia! Check out this live feed of another avian species:

According to their website, this exciting live stream offers viewers around the world a chance to observe peregrine falcons nesting in downtown Richmond. Their timing coincides with the falcons' breeding season, and they suspect the first egg could be laid as early as this weekend. Peregrine falcons are listed as state-threatened in Virginia with more than 30 pairs, including the Richmond birds, nesting across the Commonwealth each spring. Both the female and male from recent years has been observed on camera almost daily over the past few weeks. This pair has been nesting here since 2021 and has raised four chicks together every year since then.

Registration for the 2025 Virginia 4-H Congress is now open! This year's theme, "Turning Gears, Shaping Futures," will guide an inspiring week of learning, leadership, and connection.

2025 PROGRAM INFORMATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ 4-H STATE COMPETITIONS: 4-H members have a chance to compete with their peers from across the state. Participants with high scores in each blue-ribbon category will be recognized during the Closing ceremony on Friday, June 21st. Please see the competition information for more details.
- ★ PRE-CONGRESS ACTIVITY: Upon arrival, units and their chaperones can participate in a self-guided campus scavenger hunt after settling into the dorms. The State 4-H Office will provide all materials for the scavenger hunt. This will be a great activity to familiarize yourself and your delegation with the areas of campus we will be visiting throughout Congress.
- ★ WELCOME TO CONGRESS MIXER! On Tuesday evening, you can enjoy a welcome mixer, which will be held on Dietrick Lawn. This fun time will be hosted by your current State 4-H Cabinet members, along with Meet and Greets by the Congress Cabinet Candidates and 4-H All-Stars. There will be plenty of get-to-know-you activities, ice cream, and fun to go around!
- ★ OPENING SESSION: Featuring Mario Ferruzzi, Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Virginia Tech!
- ★ EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS: During State 4-H Congress, delegates will have the opportunity to choose from a variety of workshops with hands-on and engaging learning experiences. Congress workshops will consist of two interactive 60-minute sessions on Wednesday morning, followed by a longer 90-minute session on Thursday morning. Participants will be asked to select their top five (5) 3 workshop choices, and final assignments will be made prior to check-in. There is a listing of 2025 workshops in this packet and on the Congress website.
- ★ DANCES: At least one dance will be held. This is another great opportunity for delegates to mingle and meet other Congress participants. Alternate recreation will be available for those delegates who choose not to participate in the dance.
- ★ OPPORTUNITY FAIR: At the opportunity fair, participants can discover diverse pathways to participate in 4-H activities, interact with representatives from numerous ambassador groups, and access valuable resources to shape their future endeavors.
- COLOR RUN/WALK: Join us for our Color Run/Walk on Wednesday evening. This unique paint race celebrates healthiness, happiness, and individuality. Participants will receive a t-shirt and to participate in this event. There will be an additional cost of \$10 to participate in this event, and proceeds will help to support the State 4-H Congress.
- ★ SERVICE LEARNING: Each delegate will participate in a service learning project that will be held on Wednesday afternoon.
- CONGRESSIONAL GAMES: Congressional Games are coming back this year allowing Districts to compete in both individual and team activities. Points will be awarded in each category to districts based on participation and standing. Tournament style brackets will be utilized and games may include corn hole, volleyball, 3 on 3 basketball, 4 square, chess and other board games, swimming, and more!
- * **RECOGNITION OF 4-H ALL STARS:** During 4-H Congress, current and those who will be tapped into the All Stars will be recognized during an opening assembly program, and the tapping ceremony will be held on Thursday afternoon.





PW 4-H FAMILIES, CAN YOU HOST A YOUTH DELEGATE FROM JAPAN THIS SUMMER?

Virginia 4-H has committed to hosting 20 youth delegates and 2 adult chaperones from Japan this summer.

Hosting Details and Requirements:

- Program runs July 23 through August 16, 2025
- No previous 4-H experience is required
- Host families receive no stipend to host a delegate.
- All Host families will be screened and interviewed as part of our risk management protocol
- Japanese delegates are ages ~13-16
- To host a delegate, a family must have a child who is 10+ years old
- Families without young people at home can host adult chaperones
- Families hosting youth delegates must provide adult supervision during the daytime
- Families will identify a host sibling and will be matched with a delegate of the same gender who is within 4 years of the host youth's age.
- Japanese delegates have a range of English language abilities.
- Delegates are here to experience every day American life. No special activities need to be planned.
- Host Families will receive support from the state coordinator and other host families before, during & after the exchange (not financial)


