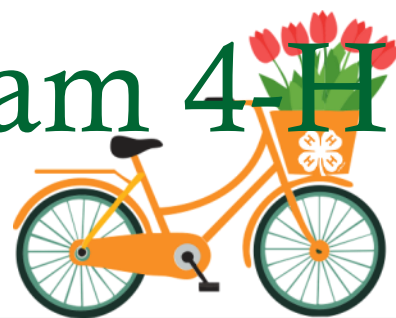

IT'S HATCH TIME! The moment we've been waiting for is finally here! Just a few reminders:

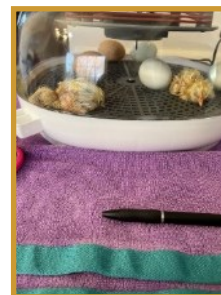
- Never help the chicks from their shell.
- Remove chicks from incubator and place in warm brooder 2-6 hrs. after hatch (if it is an evening or weekend, 6-12hrs. is okay).
- Remove and discard all remaining unhatched eggs 60 hrs. after the first chick hatches.
- Separate unhealthy chicks from the healthy ones – this would require a second brooder.

Nokesville Equestrian 4-H Club Saddling Up for State Competitions



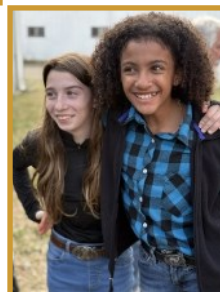

After the contests, youth attended clinics that discussed the elements of the contests and provided participants with tips and tricks and the correct answers. The expert judges provided critical feedback to help 4-H'ers improve their hippology scores, horse judging eye, and reasons delivery.

2025 SPRING AIR CHAMPIONSHIP

Last weekend, 25 members of the Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club participated in the annual Virginia 4-H 2025 Spring Air Championship at the W.E. Skelton 4-H Educational and Conference Center in Wirtz, Virginia. Over 160 competitors from 21 different 4-H clubs attended the event. The competition included air rifle, air pistol, BB gun, archery, public speaking, presentations, and rifle and pistol silhouettes. Trigger Time finished strong in team categories as well as individual rankings.

Sweeping the air rifle discipline, seven Trigger Time members placed in the top eight overall. In the air rifle finals, Lexi Strand outshot Rebecca Ahrens and claimed the title of Spring Air rifle champion. Trigger Time's Team A (Rebecca Ahrens, Lexi Strand, Tanner Ridings, and Ayden Strand) took 1st place with a score of 2119, and Team B (Noah Richter, Samantha Holmes, Caleb Hoogasian, and Jubilee Richter) was 2nd with 1891. Trigger Time Team C (Tonchi Mintz, Koa Mintz, Charley Murphy, and Sophie Carter) placed 5th.

A special shoutout to Tonchi Mintz (508-7) and Samantha Holmes (505-10) for breaking 500 for the first time ever for new personal bests!

Continuing their success, Trigger Time's BB gun team ranked 2nd. The contributing members were Rebecca Ahrens, Ayden Strand, Jubilee Richter, Alexander Wolpert, and Adam Grant. Under air pistol, Trigger Time's International Standing team (Noble Richter, Noah Richter, and Ayden Strand) took 1st with all three members ranking in the top eight. Following the finals, Noble Richter took 2nd place. Representing Trigger Time in the mixed position air pistol team category, Valor Richter, Steven Ahrens and Verity Teasley placed 3rd.

During the weekend, Trigger Time members enjoyed socializing with other Virginia 4-H teams and encouraging teammates. Many thanks to our Trigger Time coaches and leaders for helping plan and run the event.

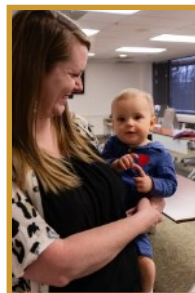
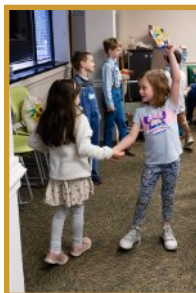


Prince William 4-H Cloverbud Club Practiced Manners

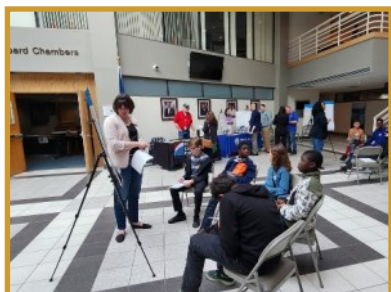


Prince William 4-H'ers Attend Local Government Day

- ★ Campaigning will be virtual! Virtual Town Halls will be held for each of the five districts and one for officer candidates. They are scheduled as follows:
 - June 8th @ 7 PM – Officer Candidates
 - June 10th @ 7 PM – Northwest District
 - June 12th @ 7 PM – Individual Town Halls for Central, Northeast, Southeast, and Southwest Districts
- ★ Voting is electronic! 4-H members from across Virginia who were enrolled with an individual email address in 4-H Online will be allowed to vote.

Registration for the 2025 Virginia 4-H Congress is now open! This year's theme, **"Turning Gears, Shaping Futures,"** will guide an inspiring week of learning, leadership, and connection.

2025 PROGRAM INFORMATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ **4-H STATE COMPETITIONS:** 4-H members have a chance to compete with their peers from across the state. Participants with high scores in each blue-ribbon category will be recognized during the Closing ceremony on Friday, June 21st. Please see the competition information for more details.
- ★ **PRE-CONGRESS ACTIVITY:** Upon arrival, units and their chaperones can participate in a self-guided campus scavenger hunt after settling into the dorms. The State 4-H Office will provide all materials for the scavenger hunt. This will be a great activity to familiarize yourself and your delegation with the areas of campus we will be visiting throughout Congress.
- ★ **WELCOME TO CONGRESS MIXER!** On Tuesday evening, you can enjoy a welcome mixer, which will be held on Dietrick Lawn. This fun time will be hosted by your current State 4-H Cabinet members, along with Meet and Greets by the Congress Cabinet Candidates and 4-H All-Stars. There will be plenty of get-to-know-you activities, ice cream, and fun to go around!
- ★ **OPENING SESSION:** Featuring Mario Ferruzzi, Dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at Virginia Tech!
- ★ **EDUCATIONAL WORKSHOPS:** During State 4-H Congress, delegates will have the opportunity to choose from a variety of workshops with hands-on and engaging learning experiences. Congress workshops will consist of two interactive 60-minute sessions on Wednesday morning, followed by a longer 90-minute session on Thursday morning. Participants will be asked to select their top five (5) 3 workshop choices, and final assignments will be made prior to check-in. There is a listing of 2025 workshops in this packet and on the Congress website.
- ★ **DANCES:** At least one dance will be held. This is another great opportunity for delegates to mingle and meet other Congress participants. Alternate recreation will be available for those delegates who choose not to participate in the dance.
- ★ **OPPORTUNITY FAIR:** At the opportunity fair, participants can discover diverse pathways to participate in 4-H activities, interact with representatives from numerous ambassador groups, and access valuable resources to shape their future endeavors.
- ★ **COLOR RUN/WALK:** Join us for our Color Run/Walk on Wednesday evening. This unique paint race celebrates healthiness, happiness, and individuality. Participants will receive a t-shirt and to participate in this event. There will be an additional cost of \$10 to participate in this event, and proceeds will help to support the State 4-H Congress.
- ★ **SERVICE LEARNING:** Each delegate will participate in a service learning project that will be held on Wednesday afternoon.
- ★ **CONGRESSIONAL GAMES:** Congressional Games are coming back this year allowing Districts to compete in both individual and team activities. Points will be awarded in each category to districts based on participation and standing. Tournament style brackets will be utilized and games may include corn hole, volleyball, 3 on 3 basketball, 4 square, chess and other board games, swimming, and more!
- ★ **RECOGNITION OF 4-H ALL STARS:** During 4-H Congress, current and those who will be tapped into the All Stars will be recognized during an opening assembly program, and the tapping ceremony will be held on Thursday afternoon.
- ★ **ALL STAR TAPPING:** The All Star tapping will be held in an indoor location on Thursday afternoon. All Congress delegates (youth and adult participants) are expected to attend the All-Star tapping.
- ★ **ALL STAR ORIENTATION:** The All Star orientation will be held on Thursday from 2:45 - 3:45 PM.
- ★ **STATE AWARDS AND CLOSING CEREMONY:** On Friday morning, State 4-H Congress will close out with a special closing ceremony. This closing ceremony will honor all State 4-H Congress award recipients, including competition winners, 2025 National 4-H Congress delegates, Innovative Programming Awards, Fun Run winners, etc., and installing the 2025-26 State 4-H Cabinet. We will also hear remarks from Virginia Secretary of Agriculture and Forestry Matt Lohr!

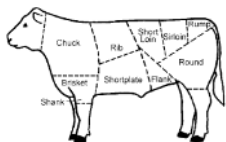

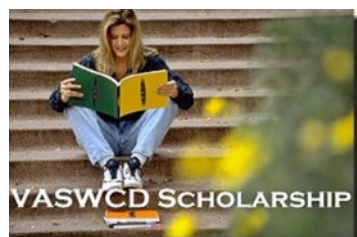

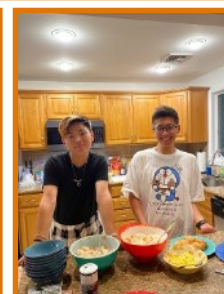

Its programs and employment are open to all, regardless of age, color, disability, sex (including pregnancy), gender, gender identity, gender expression, national origin, political affiliation, race, religion, sexual orientation, genetic information, military status, or any other basis protected by law.
