Nokesville 4-H Club Collects over 1,000 lbs of Food Donations

The idea began when Prince William's Nokesville 4-H Community Club Leader Shealyn Clinger encouraged a March project focused on food and nutrition. Youth 4-H'er Michael DeRoche suggested a food drive and reached out to Meg Carroll, a Georgetown South community leader and volunteer who organizes local food distributions.



Wanting to expand the impact, Michael helped grow the project into a county-wide 4-H effort. With the support of Extension Officer MaryBeth Lerch, Trigger Time Club members, Prince William 4-H families, and generous community members, the food drive was a great success. Michael also coordinated an outreach effort at Giant Food, which significantly increased the amount of donations. It was a great learning experience from creating flyers, to promoting the drive at various occasions business meetings, Bingo, to learning how to make it more successful by creating 'most needed items" flyers to hand out to shoppers at the entrances.

In total, the drive collected over 1,000 pounds of food, providing more than 1,000 meals for local families.



This project was especially meaningful to Michael, who attends school with many children living in Georgetown South and understands how much families rely on school meals - especially during school breaks.

It was a humbling and heartwarming experience to see so many people come together - from club members and volunteers to strangers at the grocery store - to support families in need. The teamwork and generosity from the community made it possible to accomplish something far beyond what Michael ever imagined when the idea first began.

Nokesville 4-H Club is beyond grateful to everyone at Prince William 4-H for support and this opportunity to make a meaningful impact.

Last week, five members of Trigger Time 4-H Shooting Education Club competed in the CMP 3PAR Northeast Regional Championship at Camp Perry in Port Clinton, Ohio. The match lasted over three days with practice on the first day and 3x20 matches on the second and third days. When the two competition scores were added together, the top eight individuals participated in the finals. Trigger Time finished in 8th place with a score of 4250. The team members were Lexi Strand (1091-29), Rebecca Ahrens (1089-29), Tanner Ridings (1060-27), and Ayden Strand (1010-17). Alternate Samantha Holmes scored 1017-19. All of the returning team members improved their scores from last year: Lexi improved by 23 points, Rebecca by 27 points, and Ayden by 81 points. Both Samantha and Tanner scored personal records during the matches as well.

Finishing in 7th place overall, Lexi Strand qualified for the finals. She held 1st place through the kneeling stage of the finals competition, landing in 4th overall, just one tenth of a point behind 3rd place. Rebecca Ahrens received a medal for 1st place in the U15 division and placed 9th overall. Lexi received a medal for 4th.

Between matches, Trigger Time members enjoyed playing cards and walking on the beach along Lake Erie. To take their minds off the competition, the team went to the theater to watch the Minecraft movie. In June Trigger Time will return to Camp Perry for the CMP 3PAR National Sporter Championship.

Applications are now open for senior Virginia 4-H'ers to participate in 2025 National 4-H Congress. For more than 100 years, National 4-H Congress has served as the premiere educational and recognition event for senior 4-H members. National Congress provides participants an exciting opportunity to explore careers, engage in a variety of quality learning experiences, and have great fun by getting to know other 4-H members from across the country. Outstanding 4-H members will be selected to represent Virginia at National 4-H Congress. Candidates for selection must be senior 4-H members in the current 4-H year who are able to demonstrate outstanding achievement as a 4-H member in the areas of leadership, citizenship, and personal development.

During this submission process, applicants will be asked to submit their cover letter, resume, three letters of recommendation, and a photo.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Virginia 4-H values the life skills that members develop through personal record keeping. An electronic 4-H portfolio, which replaced the 4-H Achievement Record, will serve as the foundation for a 4-H member's application to participate in National 4-H Congress, if selected for an interview. The formal process includes two steps, which are intended to provide the 4-H member learning exercises that reflect an employment application and interview procedure:

- 1. The submission of a written personal resume; and
- 2. For those selected to interview, a presentation of an electronic personal portfolio (detailed information on the electronic portfolio will be provided to all youth selected to be interviewed)

Those selected for an interview will need a working Gmail account, as electronic portfolios will be submitted through Google Classroom.




2023 INBOUND Program impact




