THE SUN WAS SHINING ON US!

We had over 20 volunteers turn out on Saturday at 5 County Complex for Prince William 4-H's Tree Planting Day to complete our annual community service project "Growing Trees and Kids for Virginia's Forest." Sponsored by the Virginia Department of Forestry and the Virginia Cooperative Extension, the project offers free hardwood seedlings to schools and youth groups in the greater Prince William area. The purpose of this project is to improve water quality by restoring forest cover to residential and riparian lands.

Prince William County Arborist Will Shoup began our day with an informative presentation about the importance of planting Virginia natives and a demonstration on how to properly plant trees. He then

led us to a nearby storm water management pond where we planted native buttonbush to help control erosion and create an attractive habitat for birds and animals.

We may have been a bit enthusiastic about providing a habitat for birds and animals... WE PLANTED ISO TREES!

NOKESVILLE 4-H CLUB



Prince William's Nokesville 4-H Community Club had a busy weekend using their head, heart, hands, and health to grow their 4-H skills, serve the community, and show Planet Earth a little love. Not only did they provide a service at the club, community, and world levels, but they also touched on all four 4-H Pillars: Citizenship, STEM, Agriculture, and Healthy Living.

Rising youth leader Michael DeRoche coordinated with the Manassas City arborist Dan Spoden to determine a planting site that matched the native seedlings available through the Prince William 4-H Tree Seedling

Program. The Club's efforts expanded what PW 4-H was able to accomplish this weekend with an additional 25 buttonbush seedlings planted by Wakeman Pond. Nokesville 4-H'ers and friends discussed SMART goals and learned why buttonbush is such a valuable native plant - especially near wetlands and stormwater areas. Its deep roots help prevent erosion and absorb runoff, and its unique globe-shaped flowers attract pollinators like bees, butterflies, and hummingbirds. Wood ducks are also known to nest in buttonbush thickets, using the dense cover to shelter their young.

Volunteers also collected 7 full bags of litter from the area, further protecting the ecosystem and waterway. The small but mighty group committed their beautiful spring break day to service!



Applications are now open for senior Virginia 4-H'ers to participate in 2025 National 4-H Congress. For more than 100 years, National 4-H Congress has served as the premiere educational and recognition event for senior 4-H members. National Congress provides participants an exciting opportunity to explore careers, engage in a variety of quality learning experiences, and have great fun by getting to know other 4-H members from across the country. Outstanding 4-H members will be selected to represent Virginia at National 4-H Congress. Candidates for selection must be senior 4-H members in the current 4-H year who are able to demonstrate outstanding achievement as a 4-H member in the areas of leadership, citizenship, and personal development.

During this submission process, applicants will be asked to submit their cover letter, resume, three letters of recommendation, and a photo.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Virginia 4-H values the life skills that members develop through personal record keeping. An electronic 4-H portfolio, which replaced the 4-H Achievement Record, will serve as the foundation for a 4-H member's application to participate in National 4-H Congress, if selected for an interview. The formal process includes two steps, which are intended to provide the 4-H member learning exercises that reflect an employment application and interview procedure:

- 1. The submission of a written personal resume; and
- 2. For those selected to interview, a presentation of an electronic personal portfolio (detailed information on the electronic portfolio will be provided to all youth selected to be interviewed)

Those selected for an interview will need a working Gmail account, as electronic portfolios will be submitted through Google Classroom.
