

DECLARATIONS ARE OPEN

ALL DECLARATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY JULY 1 AT 11:59 PM.

- ANY Horse or Pony that a youth MAY show at the State Show must be declared in 4HOnline in order to be eligible to show.
- Please be prepared when beginning your declarations with current photos of your animal, Coggins test date, and an accurate height measurement. The correct measurement is imperative, as it is tied to "Animal Type" and linked to specific classes within the entry system. If the height entered is incorrect, it will affect your ability to enter classes. If you notice your height is incorrect, you must re-add that animal as a new animal in order to input the correct measurement, the system will not allow changes.
- If you are declaring a Horse/Pony that you declared last year or in a previous year, you do have the option to re-declare a previously added animal. Please note, if your height/animal type is incorrect due to a previous entry error, you will need to add a new animal and provide all new information. There is no opportunity to change the Animal Type. Additionally, if using an animal from a previous year, please ensure that you upload a CURRENT Coggins Test and edit to reflect the updated Coggins Test date for 2025.



- Central water hook-up – Campers must bring a 100ft of hose o Each spot is \$176.48 (Tax included) for the length of the show (Wednesday, October 1st – Sunday, October 5th)

USDA Shares Food Safety Recommendations for Your Potluck

Make sure your summer dish is remembered for its flavor, not a foodborne illness. Keep these potluck food safety tips from the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Food Safety and Inspection Service (FSIS) in mind.



Travel Safely:

- Place perishable foods like meat, poultry, egg or seafood salads directly from the refrigerator or freezer into a cooler.
- When transporting cold dishes, use a cooler packed with ice or gel packs to maintain a temperature of 40 degrees F or below.
- Keep hot foods at or above 140 degrees F by wrapping dishes in insulated bags or towels.
- Transport your cooler in the air-conditioned passenger compartment of your vehicle.

Avoid the Danger Zone:

- The bacteria that can cause foodborne illness grow between 40 degrees F and 140 degrees F - also known as the Danger Zone.
- If you plan to keep perishable foods on the table for more than two hours (or one hour in temperatures above 90 degrees F), keep hot foods hot and cold foods cold to avoid the Danger Zone.
- Keep hot foods heated at or above 140 degrees F with chafing dishes or preheated grill.
- Keep cold foods chilled at or below 40 degrees F by placing them on bowls of ice or keeping them inside a cooler near the picnic table.

Think Nonperishables:

Whole fruits, whole vegetables, bagged chips and dips, dried fruits, nuts and beef jerky are good alternatives that do not require refrigeration.
