

## NOTICE OF WILLINGNESS

### Old Carolina Road Shared Use Path Improvements

Prince William County Department of Transportation (PWC DOT), in cooperation with the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) proposes the construction of an approximately 1,000-foot segment of 10-foot wide shared-use path on Old Carolina Road to connect existing facilities at the intersection with Heathcote Boulevard and the existing asphalt trail just north of the bridge over I-66 at Walter Robinson Lane. The shared use path construction will require dedication of right of way and easements from multiple adjacent properties.

In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and 23 CFR 771, a Programmatic Categorical Exclusion (PCE) has been prepared under an agreement between VDOT and the Federal Highway Administration for the project. In compliance with the National Historic Preservation Act, Section 106 and 36 CFR Part 800, information concerning the potential effects of the proposed project on properties listed in or eligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places is also provided in the environmental document.

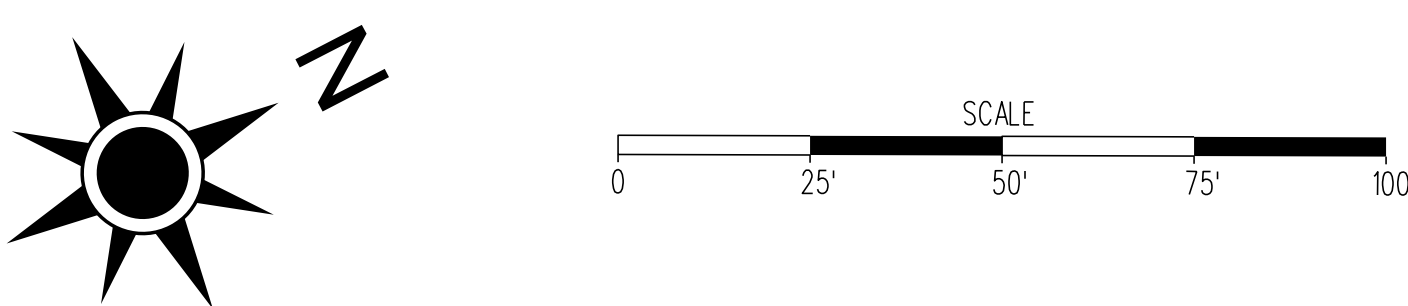
